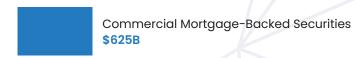
Significant yield potential. Low correlation. Total return potential.

Long duration, low cash flow, credit sensitive NARMBS (non-agency residential mortgage-backed securities)

Short duration, high cash flow, prepay sensitive NARMBS

Short duration, high cash flow, private senior secured commercial real estate loans

- Loans used to fund commercial properties and backed by the actual property
- Targeting conservative loan-to-values and 1 to 2-year durations. Senior in cap structure. Liquidity premium of 4%+

Correlation: The statistical relationship between the price movements of two or more financial assets. It quantifies how their prices tend to move together, either in the same direction (positive correlation) or in opposite directions (negative correlation). Effective Duration: Provides a measure of a fund's interest rate sensitivity; the higher the value of a fund's duration, the more sensitive the fund is to shifts in interest rates.
